- Operates 24/7/365
- Serves portions of Milford & Wilton residents, businesses & industries
- Capacity to treat 2.15 MGD normal flow with up to 6.5 MGD peak flow

## Regulation

- In November 2020, the EPA issued a new discharge permit to reduce phosphorus & metals into the Souhegan River

## Where We Are

- WWTF needs upgrades to the Main Pump Station, Primary Clarifiers, Aeration Tanks, Sludge Holding Tanks & Disinfection Building
- Engineering study & design are underway with anticipated Spring 2023 project bidding
- Upgrades include energy efficiency & operational improvements
- Construction is anticipated to take 2-3 years
